Is our Region 8 RPI work redundant?

- What about CEDS? What about Transformation Agenda?
- Worked hard to find our unique role.
- More time in tier one = more clarity

Question Two: Draft Response

- Time required to build trust among collaborators
- Familiarity and understanding of partner organizations needed

Question Two: Draft Response

- Initial desire to push directly to action strategies
- We had to resist the reach for near-term, project level success
- Instead we worked to construct long-term collaborative relationships for long-term success

Question Two: Draft Response

- Look outside the immediate inner-circle
- Engage organizations w/in five sectors but outside the collaborative

Question Three

- Specifically identify those required
- Outline additional prospective partners (that have been contacted but have not submitted formal letters of support)
- Denote changes to participant list from year one

Proposed additions:

Question Two

- ID needs that a second grant would fulfill.
- Acknowledge similar projects, explain why ours differs.

Question Two: Proposed Response

- We have acknowledged other good regional work
- SW MI 1st & CEDS (SWMPC & SMPC)
- Multi-Sectorial representation across seven counties not otherwise addressed
- We are learning the context for our work
- How can our work complement the other regional work?

Question Two: Proposed Response

Addition of sectors not previously represented

- Interest has been expressed to us by:
 - Health care
 - K-12 education

Building Collaborative Structure

- Engage in group decision-making
- RPI Prosperity Plan provides the “why” for Collaborative Action
 - But doesn’t answer the “how”
- Must build criteria for how to evaluate projects
- Efficient allocation of group assets (not just \$)

Our Role as Convener

- Opportunity for us to act as convener for other sectors that fall into RPI Region 8 geography
 - When our work might be **mutually complementary**
 - Prosperity Plan can help us make those decisions
