### Call to Order

Chair Minkus called the meeting to order at 10:06 a.m. at the Road Commission of Kalamazoo County

# Approval of March 27, 2017 Rural Task Force 3# Meeting Minutes

No comments or changes were offered to the draft minutes of the March 27, 2017 meeting.

MOTION by Kline, SUPPORT by Minger, "to approve the March 27, 2017 Rural Task Force #3 Meeting Minutes as presented." Motion passed.

# Phone Call with Don Mayle of MDOT Planning

Mr. Mayle, the new Rural Task Force program manager for the Michigan Department of Transportation joined the meeting at approximately 10:12. He opened by discussing the new MDOT policy of not allowing counties with negative EDD balances obligate EDD funding. There were questions from task force members regarding the method used to determine individual county balances. It was noted that in prior

years deals had been made within the task force to forego EDD funding for several years in order to program larger projects and that such deals may not be properly reflected in the current balance calculations. Mr. Mayle agreed to pull reports from as far back as possible to illustrate how the balances were determined and provide them to Welch and Nagler, who will distribute them to the rest of the task force.

Mr. Mayle stated that MDOT is in the process of working to see that the map of all-season "D" routes is up to date. He will send pdf and shape files of the maps to Nagler who will distribute them to the rest of the task force members.

It is anticipated that the new guidelines for the County Local Federal Fund Exchange Pilot program will be completed by January. In response to a question he said that counties must have their projects prioritized and in the TIP prior to the sale of federal funds to counties outside of the RTF so that it can be documented that the planning process is being followed and work on those RTF-approved federal aid projects is still being done. In response to another inquiry, he said that trading EDD for MTF funds within the RTF is acceptable as long as he is informed so that MDOT Finance can make the proper adjustments to the individual counties' EDD balances.

More discussion took place regarding the EDD balances and how they were determined. Barry County will send Mr. Mayle copies of previous years' balance sheets in their files. Mr. Mayle suggested that the group not make any changes to the EDD program until he has a chance to see that everything is in order with the balances.

# Review of 2018 Projects and Target Balances

Nagler presented the current STL and EDD obligation authority targets and balances. More discussion was had regarding targets and balances and difference in how federal and state funding is currently being accounted for within the RTF by MDOT.

MOTION by Arver, SUPPORT by Welch "to not make any changes to currently approved EDD targets and to change the Region Approved Target amount to the MDOT Obligation Constraint Target for EDD." Motion passed after discussion regarding obligation timeframe.

MOTION by Arver, SUPPORT by Kline "to transfer \$40,000 of EDD from Branch to Calhoun for 2018, to be repaid in 2019." Motion Passed.

MOTION by Myland, SUPPORT by Welch "to delete St. Joseph County's 2018 Featherstone Road, Fawn River and Michigan Avenue/Silver Street projects and to add a 2018 Countywide Preventive Maintenance Project for \$526,843 in STL and \$131,711 in local cost. Motion Passed

# Discussion of Fund Exchanges within RTF #3

Arver and Kline indicated that Branch County is working on an agreement with Calhoun County for exchange of STL funding at a rate to be agreed upon.

MOTION by Welch, SUPPORT by Kline "to approve a trade between Branch and Calhoun counties where Branch will sell all their 2018 STL funding." Motion Passed after discussion and indication from Branch County Transit of their approval.

### Discussion of Fund Exchanges Outside of RTF #3

St. Joseph and Barry Counties are in discussion with Jackson County to sell them all their STL funds not already allocated to transit projects. Barry County does not have a total dollar amount yet as it will depend on the status of the EDD fund balance review. It was agreed that no action would be taken at this time.

## Updates of 2019 - 2020 Projects

Branch County indicated that they would like to move their 2018 Sherwood project to 2019 and the 2020 Transit project to 2018, keeping the funding levels the same. It was noted that this can be done via Administrative Modification but members of the Task Force informally indicated their approval.

St. Joseph Transit indicated that their 2020 project is incorrectly listed as a Bus Shelter and should be changed to a Bus Replacement.

MOTION by Welch, SUPPORT by Minger "to delete the Barry County 2019 Hickory Road project and add a Replacement Transit Vehicle for \$50,000 in STL funding, and add Countywide Preventive Maintenance for the remainder of available STL and EDD with no local match." Motion passed.

# **Review of Bylaws**

Copies of the current and proposed revised bylaws were included in the meeting packet. Minkus suggested two changes to make wording and terminology more consistent with the remainder of the document.

MOTION by Welch, SUPPORT by Kline "to approve the revised bylaws, amended as suggested by Minkus." Motion Passed. Nagler will make the changes and bring the final draft to the next full RTF #3 meeting for signatures of the five county representatives.

### **Public Comment**

Tony Bowling and Gary White of the Village of Tekonsha expressed interest in having a Preventive Maintenance project in the village added to the RTF Transportation Improvement Program. It was suggested that they attend the Calhoun County Local Task Force meeting that will be with the 2020 – 2023 Call for Projects, as the 2017 – 2020 TIP is already programmed.

### Spring 2018 Meeting Schedule

It was decided that a meeting should be scheduled for mid to late January to revisit programming of EDD projects and finalize details for any federal fund exchanges outside of RTF #3. This should give MDOT and locals time to locate and review historical documentation of individual county balances and finalize the new fund exchange guidelines. The next meeting is tentatively scheduled for January 31, 2018 at the Road Commission of Kalamazoo County. The date may be changed if the needed information is not ready by then.

### **Other Business**

No other business was brought forth.

# Rural Task Force #3

### **ARTICLE I-NAME**

The name of this Task Force shall be "Rural Task Force #3".

### **ARTICLE II-PURPOSE**

The Rural Task Force Program provides federal and state dollars by region to rural counties with a population under 400,000 (78 out of 83 counties in Michigan). These dollars must be spent within the Region, comprised of Barry, Branch, Calhoun, Kalamazoo, and St. Joseph Counties. Road and transit capital projects are eligible.

The money is provided within two funding sources:

- 1. Surface Transportation Program Rural (STL) for improving the federal aid system and rural transit; and
- 2. State TEDF Category D (EDD) for building and maintaining the all-season road network

All final project selection is through the Rural Task Force which is comprised of equal representation from the five County Sub-Task Forces within the Region; Barry, Branch, Calhoun, Kalamazoo, and St. Joseph.

# I. Project Location

- **a.** Projects shall be located on roads that have been functionally classified as rural major collectors or higher according to the National Functional Classification System approved by the Federal Highway Administration or;
- **b.** A Federal Transit Administration recognized rural transit provider within the Region.
- **c.** Money can be spent on rural minor collectors at the Michigan Department of Transportation's discretion.

### II. Compliance

a. Projects shall be in compliance with all Federal and/or State standards unless waived by the agency having authority to do so.

### III. Funding Sources/Matching/Requirements

- a. STL.
  - i. Construction Costs and contingencies for highway projects are eligible for STL funding. Right-of-way (ROW), construction engineering (CE), and preliminary engineering (PE) costs are a local responsibility, unless they are waived by the Rural Task Force #3..
  - ii. Transit capital projects are also eligible for STL funds.
  - iii. STL funding requires at least a 20% non-federal match. This could be either State TEDF Category D, State Comprehensive Transportation Fund or local match

### b. EDD

- i. Road must be classified as rural primary or higher
- ii. The road also must be designated as an all-season "D" route or the proposed EDD funding must be used to upgrade the route to an all-season road
- iii. TEDF-Category D projects must be funded with at least 20 percent of the cost coming from a non-TEDF source (i.e., STP-Rural, local, etc.) This stipulation can be waived by the Michigan Department of Transportation Office of Economic Development if the county or city can prove economic hardship.

### **ARTICLE III-MEMBERSHIP**

The membership of the Rural Task Force shall consist of six (6) members. The membership shall include a (1) representative from each County Sub-Task Force and a (1) representative from MDOT. MDOT will vote on projects that utilize D funds.

Each member may have an alternate designated by the County Sub-Task Force which they represent, who shall have all the powers and privileges of the member in the absence of the member. The alternate is welcome to attend all meetings and enter into the discussions, but has no vote except in the absence of the member. Proxy votes will not be allowed.

## **ARTICLE IV-MEETINGS**

All meetings will adhere to the Michigan Open Meetings Act and adhere to a Public Participation Plan.

- **I.** Regular meetings
  - **a.** Regular meetings of the Rural Task Force #3 shall be held annually at a time and place to be determined by the chair of the Task Force.
  - **b.** A second meeting will be held to determine the status of current fiscal year projects at a time and place to be determined by the chair of the Task Force.
- **II.** Special meetings
  - a. Special meetings of the Rural Task Force #3 shall be held at the call of the chair or at a written request of a majority of the members of the Task Force. Notification of the meeting to the members of the Task Force and the public will meet the standards of the Michigan Open Meeting Act.
- III. Public Participation and Meeting Notice
  - **a.** Notice of all regular meetings shall be given to each member by e-mail at least seven (7) days prior to the meeting date. Notice of special meetings may be given by telephone or by e-mail, which must state purpose of the meeting.
  - b. Transportation needs of Indian Tribal Government having jurisdiction over lands within the boundaries of the Task Force are to be considered during the process.
  - c. Public involvement in the project selection process is to be encouraged and included.
- IV. Quorum
  - **a.** A simple majority of the members of the Task Force shall constitute a quorum. Alternate members present in the absence of regular members shall be counted in determining a quorum.
- V. Minutes
  - **a.** Minutes shall be taken and provided to each member and the public by the Regional Planning Agency representative.

# **ARTICLE V-OFFICERS**

The officers of the Rural Task Force #3 shall be a chairperson and vice-chairperson. The officers shall serve two (2) year terms. Elections are to be held at a Regular Meeting on odd numbered years. The chairperson shall have the right to appoint committees.

# **ARTICLE VI-AMEND ARTICLES**

The Task Force shall have power to make, alter, amend or repeal the Articles by a majority of the total membership voting in the affirmative at any regular or special meeting. A written notice of intention to make changes, including proposed changes, shall be presented to the membership prior to the meeting.

# OVERVIEW OF NON-FEDERAL AID ROADWAY CONDITON DATA COLLECTION REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM FOR KATS AND REGION 3

Starting in FY 2018, the Transportation Asset Management Council (TAMC) has given, among other tasks, the responsibility for managing the Non-Federal Aid (NFA) surface condition data collection reimbursement program to the Regional/Metropolitan Planning Organizations (RPO/MPO). As KATS is under contract with the Southcentral Michigan Planning Council (SMPC) to perform its transportation planning functions for Region 3, we are responsible for the NFA program for all of Barry, Branch, Calhoun, Kalamazoo and St. Joseph counties in addition to the Urbanized KATS area. For both the Region 3 and KATS programs, the funding for the reimbursement has been rolled into their respective TAMC work activities rather than set up as a separate line item with dedicated funding. As such, we will be required to estimate the amount of reimbursement we can authorize and still meet the remainder of the duties outlined in the annual work programs. For 2018 the estimated amounts available for NFA condition data collection reimbursement and other TAMC tasks for the two programs are \$5,000 for KATS and \$15,000 for Region 3.

In order to qualify for reimbursement, road agencies will need to apply for and receive authorization from KATS prior to performing any data collection. Requests should be made before May 1, 2018 and should include the following:

- Miles of NFA roads to be rated
- Total estimated not-to-exceed cost, including all labor, equipment and vehicles. Successful applicants will not be reimbursed for expenses in excess of the approved amount.
- Trained/certified team members' time and vehicle use

In considering applications, KATS will take into account and compare the following factors, possibly among others:

- Cost and miles of road to be rated.
- Current status of condition data on segments being applied for
- Last year that road agency was reimbursed for NFA condition data collection
- Rating team members' PASER training status

As set forth in the TAMC Policy for Collection of Roadway Condition Data, approved 9/6/2017, rating teams "shall consist of a minimum of two (2) people: one (1) member/representative of the Act 51 road agency who meets the training and/or certification requirements and one (1) member who the Act 51 road agency chooses to represent it, RPO/MPO, Act 51 agency staff or others. Untrained or uncertified raters will not be reimbursed." Agencies are encouraged to read and become familiar with the entire policy. Reimbursement will be made to an agency upon submission and satisfactory review of the Roadsoft data export to KATS. KATS will be responsible for submission of the data to TAMC.
